MOTION FOR ORDER COMPELLING TESTIMONY

Now comes the State of Maryland by Haven Kodeck, Deputy State's Attorney, and moves the court for an order compelling the testimony of Randell Finney before the Baltimore City Circuit Court and for reasons states the following:

1. Your movant is a Deputy State's Attorney for Baltimore City and is authorized to request this Order pursuant to *Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article*, § 9-123, of the *Annotated Code of Maryland*.
2. Your movant has determined:
 - a. That the State Prosecutor intends to call Randell Finney to testify before the Baltimore City Circuit in connection with the prosecution of the above-captioned matters;
 - b. That the testimony and evidence to be provided by Randell Finney may be necessary to the public interest, in that he is an essential witness for the State in each of these cases;
 - c. That Randell Finney is likely to refuse to testify on the basis of his privilege against self-incrimination.


WHEREFORE the State of Maryland respectfully prays that this Honorable Court:
