UPON CONSIDERATION of Defendant's Motion to Limit Public Statements and the State's Response herein, it is this 29<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2008, by the Circuit Court for Baltimore City, Maryland hereby,

ORDERED that the State's Attorney Office for Baltimore City, all agents and employees, the Baltimore City Police Department, all agents and employees, and the Office of the Public Defender, all agents and employees, shall not make any extrajudicial statements that could reasonably be expected to be disseminated by means of public communication regarding the merits of this case, including any statements relating to:

1. the character, credibility, reputation or criminal record of he defendant, the alleged victim, or any witness;
2. the identity or expected testimony of any witness;
3. the possibility of a plea of guilty to the offense or the existence or contents of any confession, admission, or statement given by the defendant or his refusal or failure to make a statement;
4. the performance or results of any examination or test or the refusal or failure of a person to submit to an examination or test;
5. the identity or nature of physical evidence expected to be presented;

6. any opinion as to the guilt or innocence of the defendant;
7. information a lawyer knows or reasonably should know is likely to be inadmissible as evidence in a trial;
8. any opinion of the strength of the State's case or the merits of any defense.

The information or opinions described above shall not be divulged in extrajudicial public statements even if the information is contained in a public record.
